

Saturday & Sunday, September 23 & 24, 2017 - "Three Paradoxes"- Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Colossians 1:24-29, Matthew 28:18-20

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- When we are at a breaking point (stressed, overwhelmed, tired etc.), it's usually because we put something else before Jesus
  - We can lean into "good" things and they can become idols
  - Trying to get from someone or something what only God can give (Doug's example of Meg and looking to her for unconditional love)
- If you get your vertical relationship (with God) right -> every other relationship falls into place
- Colossians 1:24-29
  - Paul begins to talk about his calling and his mission
  - He gives encouragement to stay the course
- "It makes me happy to suffer for you" (Doug paraphrase of v24)
  - We are hardwired to serve others
  - Jesus as our example (he gave up attributes of being God)
  - We have to LEARN to REJOICE in our sacrifice
    - Sometimes we want acknowledgement
    - Saying something like "After all I've done for you" means we probably aren't rejoicing in suffering for and serving others
  - 1 Peter 2:21
- Paradox = a seemingly absurd or self-contradictory statement or proposition that when investigated or explain proves to be true
- 3 Paradoxes
  - 1) Life is full when it is emptied
    - Giving our lives away to others in the name of Jesus
    - Sacrifice for others -> You get filled in the process (example of the SOAR mentors)
    - "When you serve others, you find God" Doug
  - The church is the physical body of Christ in the world
    - There is a war adjacent Christ and the church
    - Paul says he is continuing to suffer as a part of the body of Christ and FOR the body of Christ
  - 2) Affliction is an advantage
    - God uses suffering of the church to advance the church (Russian pastor "pray for persecution")
    - Matt 28:18-20: Paul's commission is the same as our commission
    - Living out the Great Commission is what gives our lives meaning
    - There WILL BE persecution when we live it out
  - 3) Jesus EVERYTHING we believe hinges on Jesus as a paradox
    - All power wrapped in total humility
    - Dead but resurrected
    - Fully God and fully man

- 5. How have you seen God make your affliction and advantage?
- 6. Talk about a time when you faced persecution for living out the great commission
- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or message?
