Key Passages: Joshua 24:1-15, Galatians 5:13, 1 Corinthians 9:19, 1 Corinthians 15:58

- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- In Nehemiah we learned that we are called to be on mission for the kingdom and that we are called to do it together in unity
- · 2 phrases from Nehemiah for the next ministry year
 - 8:1 "All of the people gathered as one man"
 - Common goals
 - Sharing in the mission
 - 6:16 "For they perceived that this work had been accomplished with the help of God"
 - People will see that God is doing it
 - We will accomplish something together and God will get glory
- 2 things we are launching: 1. Saturday service at Grace in September 2. SOAR Detroit city wide tutoring program
- Joshua 24
 - v1-2
 - God tells the people through Joshua all that he has done for them
 - How they were set free, became God's people, and had an opportunity/place for ministry
 - v14-15 God is saying I have done all of this...therefore....serve me
- The main question becomes, "Are you going to serve God or someone/something else?"
- We face the question every moment of every day: who or what do you serve
- Joshua says, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord
 - This will cost you a lot
 - It requires something of us when we say this
- We were saved to serve (just like the people of Israel)
 - In response to all God has done
 - God basically saying, "I saved you...will you serve me?"
- We don't get to decide if we will serve or not. We WILL serve someone or something, it is only a matter of who or what
- The life of a servant is a life of radical obedience to the master
 - It's more than emotion or intention, it requires ACTION
 - We serve the Lord by serving others (Galatians 5:13)
 - The word serve in NT usually referred to being a slave to Christ and one another
 - 1 Corinthians 9:19 "I make myself a slave to everyone...to win as many as possible"
- 1 Corinthians 15:58
- The message para-phrase says "throw yourself into the work of the MASTER"
- That is what we are called to do, and God will use it to make himself know

- 2. Have you made the declaration "as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord"? Why or why not?

- 4. What has serving the Lord cost you? What has it required of you?
- 5. Would you define your life as a life of radical obedience to the Master? Why or why not?
- 6. How is God calling you to "throw yourself into the work of the Master"?
- 7. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or sermon?
