Key Passages: Acts 2:42-47

Main Ideas

- What is Grace like?
  - Each person is unique and every church is unique
  - This series is to identify and teach what unique markers make Grace, Grace
  - We're a mosaic because
    - It's the gospel lived out
    - · God has called us to be reconciled to one another
  - Acts 2:42-47 "The Fellowship of Believers"
  - 4 Foundations of the church
    - 1) Doctrine (The Apostles Teachings
      - Learning and growing in what the scripture say it means to follow God
      - What we believe about God governs and informs everything we do (this is where 15 minutes w/ God comes in)
    - 2) Fellowship
      - Meeting together in homes (outside of the synagogue/church)
      - They knew each other and cared for one another
    - 3) Communion (the specific "breaking of bread" referring to the Lord's Supper)
    - 4) Prayer
      - The foundation for our lives/families/church
    - Restorative prayer/ pre-service prayer/1000 people praying for Grace at 9:30 am
  - Even with all of this the early church went through difficulties (Doug cited many examples throughout the book of Acts)
  - Satan wants the church NOT to be one because if we are one the world would know God's love
  - Grace Survey
    - 40% at Grace less than 3 years
    - 75% attend 3 or more times each month
    - Only 23% of people are connected beyond weekend services
  - C-GROUPS = Community group
    - Setting a goal to have over 50% in C-Groups in the coming year
    - C Groups are...10-20 people, men and women, always diverse, meet in homes or at Grace, meet every other week
    - The primary purpose of C-Groups is to foster a deeper connection for encouragement and care for one another
  - 47 "one another" commands in the New Testament that have to be lived out in community
  - C-Groups are we we practice our faith and are equipped to have impact on the world
  - Unoffendable (book by Brant Hansen)
    - We have to learn to be unoffendable so we can be that way out there in the world
    - We have to learn to navigate our differences without judging of being offended
    - We will never live out our faith out in the world if we can't do it in our community here at Grace first

- 2. What is most inspiring about the way the early church community is described in Acts? Why?
- 3. Have you ever been in something like a C-Group? How did God use that community/group in your life and walk with Him?
- 4. Where and how is God calling you be more connected? How is God calling you to help others get into community?
- 5. Have you ever thought about leading a C-Group? What are some of your thoughts about it?
- 6. What is God inviting you into as a result of this passage or message?
