"The Answer"

Key Passages: Luke 14:12-24

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Now would also be a great time to allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- Jesus is at a dinner party hosted by a Jewish leader, and he gets invited because of his "rock-star" status.
- People would come to such a party and watch (creating a clear line of who is "IN" and who is "OUT").
- Our understanding of God affects everything we think/say/do.
- Jesus again shakes up the worldview of the leaders and he wants to shake up ours as well.
 - In that time and culture there was a system of reciprocity.
 - If you did something for someone they would owe you something.
 - Jesus was challenging the people to think differently.
 - In v13, Jesus tells them to invite people who were essentially "cursed".
 - Karma was a part of their worldview—people who were sick, poor, outcasts must have sinned more.
- When Jesus talked this way He blurred the lines of who was in and who was out.
- · He also challenged their "you do something for me and I'll do something for you" thinking by telling them to seek God's reward (v14).
- Jesus then tells a parable about a great banquet and an INVITATION that brings up 4 critical questions:
 - · What is the event?
 - A **GREAT BANQUET** that is a portrait of belonging, acceptance, and great satisfaction.
 - An invitation to be in the presence of the Living God, both eternally and HERE & NOW.
 - · Who is invited?
 - In short, EVERYONE.
 - · We are invited but have nothing to give.
 - No one earns the invitation. (Romans 8:31)
 - · Who will attend?
 - Only those who ACCEPT the invitation.
 - v18 Many made excuses (all of them good things, but none that interfere with the invitation).
 - · Sometimes a good thing prevents the best thing.
 - It's all inclusive (every tribe, every nation, mosaic).
 - What happens if we refuse the invitation?
 - Many will have great regret.
 - · We will stay stuck: dissatisfied; the weight of life never lifts; broken and difficult relationships.
- "Jesus is the answer to every problem you are facing."
 - Do we actually believe that?
 - We hold the answer to every problem in our city, school, country and every problem for us individually.

- 1. How do you think your view of God, right or wrong, affects you and your life personally?
- 2. When was a time when you thought about your life and world from an "I do something for you, you do something for me" perspective?
- 3. How are you doing currently at responding to God's invitation to be in His presence in the HERE & NOW?
- 4. What are your excuses for not accepting God's invitation?
- 5. What are the "good things" that could be preventing you from the best that God has for you?
- 6. What goes on in your heart when you hear Doug's quote, "Jesus is the answer to every problem you are facing?"
- 7. What does it look like for you to engage with the Lord in the problems you are facing?
- 8. What is the Lord inviting you into currently?
