

Sunday, January 15, 2017 - "Persistent in Prayer" - Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Luke 17:20-18:17

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- The past few weeks we have been examining Jesus telling his disciples what it means to be FAITHFUL
 - · Everything we have in play for the kingdom. putting our faith into action, forgiving those who sin against us
- Jesus tells the parable of the women and the judge and ends with v8: Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?"
- · When the son of man comes...
 - is referring to the 2nd coming of Christ and he is really answering the question from Chapter 17:20-21 "When will the kingdom of God come?"
 - · He's talking about eternal life and he says the Kingdom of God is in the midst of you or inside you
 - The kingdom of God is all around us, in our reach, and it's here
 - Kingdom of God is both NOW & NOT YET (here AND more to come)
- But in 17:27-28 Jesus presents a list of GOOD THINGS that can distract us from being faithful to God
 - Good things in the wrong place of priority can choke out our faithfulness
 - · Doug gave the example about how some good things have gotten in the way of him doing 15 minutes with God
- The guestion becomes: How are we to stay faithful amidst the noise?
 - Jesus answers with a parable of a women and a judge
 - Prayer = the antidote for not being in faithful
 - There is call to be Persistent in prayer
 - Widow = helpless/oppressed (only the judge ruling in her favor could give her what she needed)
 - · We are the widow
 - 18:5...The judge responds to the widow so that he doesn't get a headache from her nagging
 - And Jesus makes a profound point... If an unrighteous, selfish judge who doesn't care about anyone but himself can give
 justice how much more will God give justice <u>IF</u> we are willing to be persistent in asking
- Why to stay persistent in prayer?
 - · The need is still there
 - It's the path to peace (Philippians 4:4-7)
 - · It's the path to humility
 - Lack of prayer —> we think we don't need God
 - Us saying to God, If you don't show up, I have nothing
 - Your Prayer life is an indicator of your humility
- The pharisee and the tax collector (Luke 18:9-14)
 - Pharisee exalts himself (sometimes we have more of the pharisee in us than we know or life to admit)
 - Tax collector know's he is a "widow"
 - Like children we need to know our desperate need for our abba father

- 4. How are you doing at being persistent in prayer?
- 5. What are some of the things in your heart or your life that you need to recommit to praying for?
- 6. If your prayer life is an indicator of your humility, how are you doing at being humble before the Lord?
- 7. How would your life look different if you wholeheartedly believed that you have and can do nothing without God?
- 8. What is God calling you to or inviting you into as a result of this passage and/or message?
