

Sunday, January 29, 2017 - "Do You Trust Me?" - Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Luke 18:18-30

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- God is asking us "Do you trust me?"
- To hear & obey is the mark of a disciple of Jesus
 - Sensing or hearing what God is calling you to do
 - · Doing what He has called you to do
- The story of the rich young ruler is NOT a parable but an actual conversation that happened
- · The young man had it all: youth, wealth, and influence. He was probably a leader of some sort
- Some things come out better in the Mark/Luke versions of this encounter
 - The young man's passion
 - He humbles himself before Jesus (falls on his knees)
 - · He knew Jesus was special
- He asked the Lord, "Lord, what are you asking of me?" or "What do you require of me?"
 - This is a story about following Jesus, not following rules
 - When you ask this question, Jesus looks at you and loves you (just like he did in this story)
- Jesus offered the man a once in a lifetime opportunity
 - Sell everything you own and give it to the poor
 - · Not teaching that you must take a vow of poverty and sell all that you have
 - BUT we are called to be willing to do what Jesus asks (selling all his things was what he asked the young ruler to do...not necessarily everyone)
 - · Come & follow me
 - This would have been a big deal to be picked by a rabbi
 - It would be like leaving what you are doing and changing occupations
 - The young man gets very sad
 - Sad here is the same as when Jesus was in the garden
 - ***When God asks you to sacrifice something IT'S OK to feel sad.
 - · Sacrifice should be and is DIFFICULT
- When we ask God, "What do you require of me?" he responds with "Do you trust me?"
- We will all stand in the shoes of the rich young ruler at one point
 - What's <u>THAT</u> thing?
 - Are you willing to let it go for God?
- · Generosity is where God stretches us to trust him
 - Giving = saying I trust you
 - Sabbath = saying I trust you
- The question becomes, are we willing to ask the same question as the rich young ruler?
 - What do you require of me?
 - And to say, whatever you're calling me to do is better than what I have myself

Questions (Feel free to use all of these, some of these, or none of these)

- 1. Do you think you have wholeheartedly asked God what he requires of you? Explain
- 2. What are the things that you know God is asking of you that you are not being obedient to do?
- 3. How would you evaluate your trust in God? What makes it hard to trust Him?
- 4. When was a time when it was difficult to sacrifice something for the Lord? What did God reveal to you or show you as a result of your sacrifice?
- 5. How is God currently challenging your generosity (not just money)?
- 6. What is God calling you to or inviting you into as a result of this passage and/or message?
