

Sunday, February 12, 2017 - "Lessons from a Blind Beggar" - Doug Kempton

Key Passages: Luke 18:31-43

- Feel free to read the passage(s) out loud as a group
- · Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

Main Ideas

- How many of you want better spiritual discernment or awareness?
- · Background: Starting in Luke 9 Jesus begins walking towards Jerusalem and his death on the cross
 - He was preparing his disciples to lead the church after he was gone
- That was the 6th time Jesus foretold his own death
 - 1) He knew all that would happen to him (Yet he still went/was obedient)
 - 2) Jesus fulfilled all of the prophecies (Is 55, Is 50, Psalm 32 etc.)
 - 3) The disciples were clueless
 - They understood none of these things
 - · They were spiritually blinded
 - ***Spiritual awareness is not a matter of intellect BUT a Spirit infused thing (1 Cor)
 - It is foolishness/folly to those that are perishing
- · The story of the blind beggar
 - He cries out "Son of David" (not ordinary). He knew something those close to Jesus didn't even know
 - "Have mercy on me" (quoting King David...also not ordinary)
 - In those times everyone knew their place/status
 - There was a hierarchy of status and authority & EVERYONE had authority over the beggar
 - But he spoke up anyway...even though it could have been dangerous for him
 - Jesus Responds and heals him
 - ***The beggar put his faith into action and that was why Jesus responded***
 - "Those who could see were blind, and he who was blind could see" Doug Kempton
- 4 Lessons from the Blind Beggar
 - 1) PRECONCEIVED IDEAS AND EXPECTATIONS CAN BLIND YOU TO THE WORK OF GOD
 - Power/Privilege/Authoirty
 - We must be willing to unlearn some things

• 2) VICTORY COMES OUT OF TRAGEDY

- · Glory follows suffering
- From last week: Joseph's response was to be emboldened NOT embittered

• 3) DESPERATION FUELS MOVEMENT

- Unless you know you are blind, you will never cry out to Jesus
- We all come to God bankrupt and bring nothing to the table
- 1 John 4:1.4 "Little Children"

• 4) YOU MUST EXERCISE YOUR FAITH IF YOU WANT MORE

- · Idea behind spiritual disciplines
- 15 minutes/Coming up for prayer/LENTEN SEASON OF FASTING
- · Image of dancing
 - Following God is a dance
 - God is saying (like the picture of Doug dancing with his granddaughter) "Little children, I got ya"

Questions (Feel free to use all of these, some of these, or none of these)

- 1. Explain your spiritual awareness or your discernment? How has God been growing/challenging you in that area?
- 2. What are some of the preconceived notions or expectations that God is asking you to let go of?
- 3. How do you do with suffering? What has God showed you about suffering for his glory or victory from tragedy?
- 4. Do you feel desperate for God? Why or why not? How is God calling you to grow in desperation for Him?
- 5. How is God calling you to exercise you faith? What challenge has God put before you regarding spiritual disciplines?
- 6. How does the idea that we are God's "little children" affect you?
- 7. What is God calling you to or inviting you into as a result of this passage and/or message?
