Key Passages: Jeremiah 17:5-8

- Allow the group to share freely about what stood out to them from the passage or from Sunday's message

## Main Ideas

- Jeremia was a prophet 600 BC
  - His life was difficult (persecuted, thrown in a well and left to die)
  - He had a rough go BUT could still write about the mercy, love, blessing of God
- Jeremiah 17:7-8 (God being quoted)
- · What does it mean to be blessed?
  - It does NOT mean having everything you want
  - It does NOT mean there won't be difficulty/storms
  - You can be in the middle of the storm and still be blessed
  - In the New Testament blessed never refers to material things (sometimes our stuff is a curse not a blessing)
- Blessed = to be fully satisfied in God regardless of circumstances
  - The love and AFFIRMATION of God...we all want and need God's affirmation
  - Our heavenly father affirms and delights in us
- It's not something that we finish or somewhere that we arrive (it's a lifelong journey)
- How do we live this blessed life?
  - "Trust in the Lord"
  - We all lack trust somewhere and we all trust something (Jeremiah 17:5-6)
  - We are either blessed or cursed...it has to be one or the other...it all comes down to trust
- · What does it look like to trust?
  - Do you trust me? to give up control, to take a risk, to to enter a scary place
  - Disciplines to learn/practice trust
    - Titihing
      - First fruits
      - · Took faith
    - Sabbath
    - Quiet time with God
  - Dealing with insecurity/unforgiveness takes trust
  - Where do I not trust God?
